Quantitative Reasoning/ Science (3hrs): MATH 101, 105, 111, 112, 141, 150, 201, 202, QMTH 205; **Life:** BIOL 150, NUTR 221; **Earth:** ANTH 220, GEOL 210, 270; **Physical:** CHEM 101, PHYS 253, 256
