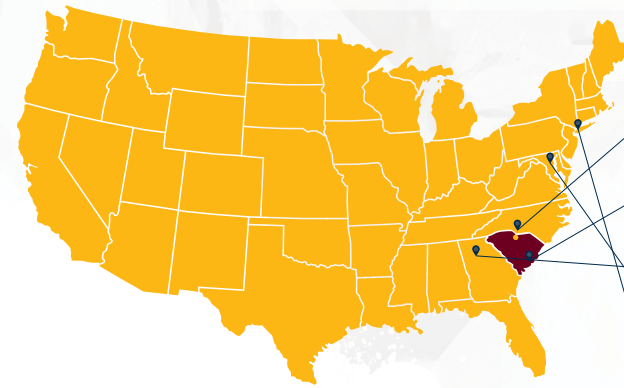

CAMPUS *services*

Students at Winthrop have access to many on-campus resources and services such as:

International Center: Provides comprehensive immigration advising, assistance in cultural adjustment, guidance on government processes such as securing a driver's license and social security card, as well as global engagement programming for the campus community and surrounding area.

Academic Success Center: Provides one-on-one tutoring for students who need assistance in particular classes, including a variety of general education courses.

English as a second language tutor: Meets one-on-one with students for whom English is not their first language to assist them with their writing skills and basic understanding of class requirements.

Writing/Math Tutorial Centers: Assists in reviewing written assignments and offering help in math if needed.

Center for Career Development and Internships: Helps students find academic internships while studying, as well as, teaching resume-writing, interview skills and finding jobs after graduation.

West Center: Offers an active site for recreation, wellness and academic pursuits.

Center for Student Wellness: Offers services to foster whole-person health through prevention, education, assessment, treatment and advocacy.

Post Office: Administers on-campus mailboxes for students who live on campus and coordinates all outgoing mail.

In addition to the application, international students are required to submit the following documents:

- Official transcripts sent directly from the high school/college
- Official evaluation of the transcripts from one of the companies on www.naces.org
- Official translation of the transcript (if applicable)
- English Language Requirement (**one of the below**):
 - TOEFL: 68 Internet-based, 520 paper-based
 - IELTS: 6, with no sub-score lower than 5
 - Successful completion of level 112 from an English Language Center
 - Graduation from a high school where English is the primary language of instruction
 - SAT Evidenced-Based Reading and Writing score of 480 or higher (for freshman applicants only)
 - A Duolingo English Test score of 95
 - Successful completion of two semesters at an accredited U.S. institution as a full-time student and completion of two semesters of English composition with a grade of C- or higher (online English composition courses are not accepted)
- A non-refundable application fee of \$60
- A copy of your passport

EXEMPTIONS:

International students from one of the following countries are exempt from the English Language Requirement:

Anguilla, Antarctica, Antigua & Barbuda, Australia, Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Bermuda, Botswana, British Indian Ocean Territory, British Virgin Islands, Brunei, Canada, Cayman Islands, Cyprus, Dominica, Falkland Islands, Fiji, Gambia, Ghana, Gibraltar, Grenada, Guyana, India, Ireland, Islas Malvinas, Jamaica, Kenya, Kiribati, Lesotho, Liberia, Malawi, Malta, Marshall Islands, Mauritius, Micronesia, Montserrat, Namibia, Nauru, New Zealand, Nigeria, Pakistan, Palau, Papua New Guinea, Philippines, Seychelles, Sierra Leone, Singapore, Solomon Islands, South Africa, Sri Lanka, St. Christopher & Nevis, St. Kitts and Nevis, St. Lucia, St. Vincent & the Grenadines, Swaziland, Tanzania, Tonga, Trinidad & Tobago, Turks and Caicos Islands, Tuvalu, Uganda, United Kingdom, Vanuatu, Vatican City, Virgin Islands, Western Samoa, Zambia and Zimbabwe.

AFTER *admission*

After admission to Winthrop University, students' acceptance packets are sent to the International Center. The International Center then provides an I-20, which is a "Certificate of Eligibility for Nonimmigrant Student Status." Students need the I-20 to apply for a student visa in the U.S. Embassy in their country of origin. Proof of funding is required before the I-20 can be issued.
