Create an Interactive Video Assignment with Edpuzzle

Overview


This tutorial will explain how to create an **Edpuzzle Assignment**. Edpuzzle integrates with Blackboard Learn and allows you to embed comprehension questions, audio notes, and voiceover into a video and make it a lesson. Interactive videos can be made with videos from a number of websites, including YouTube, TED, Vimeo, and National Geographic.

Quick Steps

Create an Edpuzzle Account > Add a Class > Search for a Video > Edit Video > Assign Video > Add Assignment in Blackboard Course > Select Video Lesson > Grade

Step 1

Create an Edpuzzle teacher account. When prompted for *Your school or organization name*, enter Winthrop University in the box to select the entry in the list.



Once the account is created any you have verified your email address, log in to Edpuzzle.

Step 2

Add a class to your account by clicking My Classes in the top right menu.



Then click Add a new class and enter a name.

Step 3

Type a subject for the video in the *Search* box then click *Search*.

Click on the video you want to use for your assignment then click *Edit* in the bottom right menu.

Step 4

Edit the video using the options in the menu above the video and click *Finish* in the upper right when finished.



Step 5

Click Assign on the button right menu.



Check the course for which the assignment should be added and click the *Assign* button.

Step 6

Log in to Blackboard and select the course for which to assign an Edpuzzle video activity. From *Build Content*, select *Edpuzzle*, enter the assignment details, and click *Submit*.

Step 7

Click on the Edpuzzle assignment, click *Launch* and enter your Edpuzzle credentials. Find and hover over the video lesson to add and click on the eye icon, click *Assign*, and click *Assign* again. The Edpuzzle video is now an assignment in your course.

Step 8

If the assignment was set for grading and there are pieces that need manual grading, log in to Edpuzzle to complete the grading. The grade is passed back to the grade center in Blackboard.



The student must watch the entire video (not scroll to the end) and see the 'Your done' message to the right of the video for the assignment to be assigned a grade in Blackboard.
